Approval of Minutes

 - Barracuda Coffee are donating 2 decaffeinated and one regular airpot of coffee.
 - Deb reported that we are in good shape.

New Business

- Deb will call Peter Blake to discuss Spring Fling for next year.
- Jackie presented T-shirt designs suggested by Chase Waller for drumline. He is asking RHSIMB for 30 T-shirts at \$22.00 each. This will need to be discussed with Jason Rose.

New Business (Continued)

- Students and parents have expressed an interest in performing at Howard Amon Park on a weekend. A table would be set up for Bomberopoly sales and donations. Students will take turns playing sets of music and interacting with young park attendees. The City of Richland needs to be contacted to inquire if permits are needed.
- Jackie reported that she still has prizes to award teams if we organize another door-to-door sale of Bomberopoly during the morning before performing in the park.
- Band members newly appointed to leadership positions are required to work cleanup at Hogs and Dogs on June 16. If they are unable to attend, they need to have someone specific attend and clean in their place.
- A question was posed about changing the meeting from the first Tuesday of each month to the second or third. Bomber Boosters also meet on the first Tuesday allowing little crossover of membership and coordination between the two groups. Jason Rose and Cassie Cook need to be consulted in order to avoid conflicts with their schedules.
- Deb Dihel made a motion to change the June meeting of the RHSIMB to June 14 at 6:30 PM. Nici seconded, none were opposed.
- Phone book delivery information is pending.
- Cassie is talking to Jason about clinicians, concerts, and festival event schedules for next year.
- Forms to sell tickets for Drums Along the Columbia will arrive for students on May 6. RHS will host Cascades this year to sleep in the cafeteria. - Central Washington University Jazz Festival details were discussed. Students will depart RHS at 6:00 AM on Saturday, May 21. Students will need to bring money for lunch on campus and dinner at Miners. It is anticipated that students will arrive at RHS at approximately 10:00 PM.
